

An honor' to be there with Mac Arthur

Eighty-seven-year-old Frank Mooney may be known to many as the "mayot of Coca-Cola Field" for his schmoozing with ballpark fans, but there's another side to him that dates from Army Gen. Douglas MacArthur keeping his promise of "I shall return " to citizens of the Philippines.

Mooney served as a navy frogman in Special Operations, which later became the navy SEAL's.

In the Pacific dring World War II, he and his fellow frogman had the unenviable job of clearing underwater obstacles, such as mines and concrete pyamids with protruding steel rods to puncture landing craft.

"We had fins, swimming trunks, a sheath knofe and goggles; no fancy underwater suits. We also wore a belt with mine detonators and we towed other explosives on a rope to be used in the destruction of the obstacles, "Mooney said. "Sometimes we put grease on our bodies because the water was so cold.

Mooney a member of Underwater Demolition Team 11, got to know the shorline waters of numerous

Pacific islands from 1941 to 1945, when he and his fellow frogmen carried out countless missions.

Among the islands, now in the pages of history, were Borneo, Java, Okinawa, to name just sevveral where Mooney and his fellow frog men blew up the submerged obstacles planted by the Japanese.

In performing their job, there were always worries about sharks and mines.

"Fortunately, in my unit, only one guy out of 80 was killed by a mine," he said, "If there was a school of sharks, the ship we were on would throw overa lot of meat to attract them away from us before we would swin. The work of the frogmen paved the way for troops from the Army and Marines to land safely with their vehicles and supples.

Frogmen often swan a total of three miles on each mission. "We were in good shape - no smoking, drinking or women." Mooney said, with a bit of a mischievous chuckle.

During preparations for the invasion of Okinawa, Mooney said, he had "the honor" ofbeing in the same boat with famed war correspondent Ernie Pyle shortly before he was killed in action.

"Just before we went into the water, he watched us receive Holy Communion. It was Easter Sunday 1945," Mooney said. Seventeen days


later, Pyle was dead. Another major moment for Mooney ocurred when he and three other frogmen cleared the shore waters for MacArthur's famous return to the Philippines.

"We cleared Leyte Gulf Je'd said I shall return, and that's what he did. I was about 25 yards from him when he came ashore. It was quite an honor to be there and welcomehim.

"He said," What ... re you guys doing here?" and he said. "We're cleaning the beach for you, general." Then we were ushered away. He had all his staff with him."

Mooney also cleared Tokyo Bay for an invasion that never happened because of the Japkanesw surrender prompted by the dropping of the atomic bombs on Hiroshima and Nagasaki.

these days, Mooney a Ford stamping plant retiree, is in the midst of his 26th yer of a second career as an acccount executive selling season and group ticket packages for the Buffalo Bisons, where he has come be know the "mayor of Coca Cola Field."

American Legion joins Rep. Josh Harder, VSOs in fight for Agent Orange benefits The American Legion AUG 21, 2020



American Legion Veterans Affairs and Rehabilitation Commission Chairman Ralph Bozella joined U.S. Rep. Josh Harder and representatives from other veterans service organizations via conference call Aug. 20 in announcing the launch of an effort to expand coverage for veterans exposed to Agent Orange but unable to access support from the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA).

Earlier this year, Harder introduced The Fair Care for Vietnam Veterans Act. The legislation would ensure Vietnam veterans with bladder cancer, certain thyroid problems and Parkinson's-like symptoms are able to access care through VA. To become law, the amendment must now be included in the final version of the National Defense Authorization Act.

"On behalf of American Legion National Commander James W. 'Bill' Oxford, I am pleased to announce The American Legion supports U.S. Rep. Josh Harder's effort to include three new Agent Orange presumptive diseases in the National Defense Authorization Act," Bozella said during the call. "The American Legion has a rich and proud history of participating in and supporting Vietnam veterans' fight for Agent Orange-related benefits.

"In 1983, The American Legion sponsored an independent study by Columbia University that established the effects of exposure to Agent Orange on Vietnam War veterans. Congress received the results of this study in 1989. Since then, the Department of Veterans Affairs has recognized 14 diseases related to exposure from Agent Orange and other herbicides."

Bozella said now is the time for VA to add the three new diseases listed in the legislation to the Agent Orange presumptive list and – noting similar legislation already has passed in the U.S. Senate – urged American Legion membership "to contact your U.S. representatives and ask each one to support this initiative, which will prove we are still welcoming home our Vietnam veterans."



VOTING IN NEW YORK STATE 2020



Registration

Register to vote by Oct. 9. (Some people — those who are honorably discharged from the military or become a naturalized citizen after Oct. 9 — can register in person by Oct. 24.) If mailed, your voter registration must be postmarked by Oct. 9 and received by Oct. 14. You can register online here.



Voting early

Counties must offer early voting Oct. 24-Nov. 1. Check with local election officials for locations and the exact schedule in your area.



In-person voting So far, no plans to close polling places have been announced.



Requesting an absentee ballot

In order to vote absentee, you must have an excuse, such as being sick or out of town on Election Day. You can download an absentee-ballot application here. The deadline to apply by mail is Oct. 27; the deadline to apply in person is Nov. 2.



Submitting an absentee ballot

Absentee ballots must be postmarked (or dropped off in person) by Nov. 3 and received by Nov. 10.



What we're watching

The state legislature has passed several bills to make it easier to vote by mail during the pandemic, including allowing voters to cite fear of the coronavirus to vote absentee. The bills are awaiting Gov. Andrew Cuomo's signature.
